



## NSCA™ Bruno Pauletto - President June, 1991, to June, 1994

**1991 - 1994** Bruno Pauletto, MS, CSCS, FNSCA is named NSCA President.

President Pauletto says “The NSCA is a diamond in the rough.” It typifies the relative youth of the NSCA as an organization, as well as the strength and conditioning profession. In both instances, there is tremendous weight and value yet, we are just beginning to appreciate each facet.”

The Pauletto era was one of change. The 1990-91 and 1991-92 expenses exceeded income. This prompted President Pauletto to make changes and implement cost cutting measures.

**1992, June 15th** - Ken Kontor resigned as Executive Director and was replaced with Maleu Fleck on Jan 1, 1993.

**1992**, Several college coaches were disgruntled with the direction of the NSCA certification program. The NSCA certification program had grown in many directions including adding personal trainers. The NSCA certification under the direction of Dr. Tom Baechle did not include experience which allowed many who were certified to get jobs in colleges that did not have the experience to be a strength coach. College Strength coaches became very upset with this and were talking about leaving the NSCA to form their own group dedicated to college strength coaches. President Bruno Pauletto asked Boyd Epley to Chair the NSCA College Strength Coaches Committee. Epley re-named the committee the Unity Council and tried to restore order in the college ranks which worked for seven years but in 2000 when the certification still did not recognize experience, a group of strength coaches created a new organization dedicated to full-time college strength coaches.

**1992, June** – the College Strength and Conditioning Professional of the Year Award is presented to Rick Huegli from the University of Washington.

**1992, June** - The High school S&C Professional of the Year was presented to Mike Burgener of Rancho Buena Vista H.S.

**1992, June** - The NSCA Presidents Award was presented to Michael Stone and R. Jeff Chandler.

**1993, January** - Maleu Fleck was hired as Executive Director. Maleu helped Bruno put the NSCA back on track financially and would eventually move the NSCA administrative headquarters to Colorado Springs.

**1992, June** - The Outstanding Sport Scientist Award was presented to Dr. William J. Kraemer. This award would be named after him in 2006.

**1993, January** - The NSCA Strength and Conditioning for Football was created in Atlanta.

**1993, July** - Boyd Epley receives the Lifetime Achievement Award from Executive Director Maelu Fleck. This marked the first time this award was ever given. The award was named the Boyd Epley Lifetime Achievement Award by the NSCA Board in April 2009.

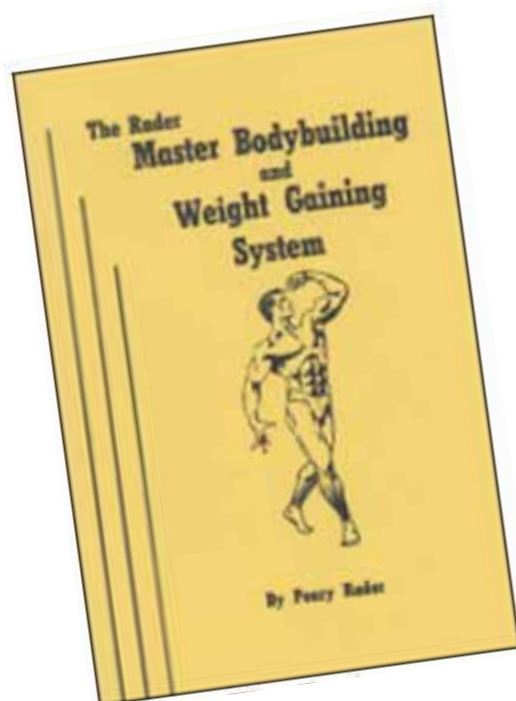
**1993, July** - College Strength and Conditioning Professional of the Year Award was presented to Michael J. Clark of Texas A&M University.

Created in 1936, Peary and Mabel Rader's Iron Man Magazine became very popular and very influential in the strength industry. Peary and Mabel were a positive influence on a lot of young people interested in weightlifting and bodybuilding.

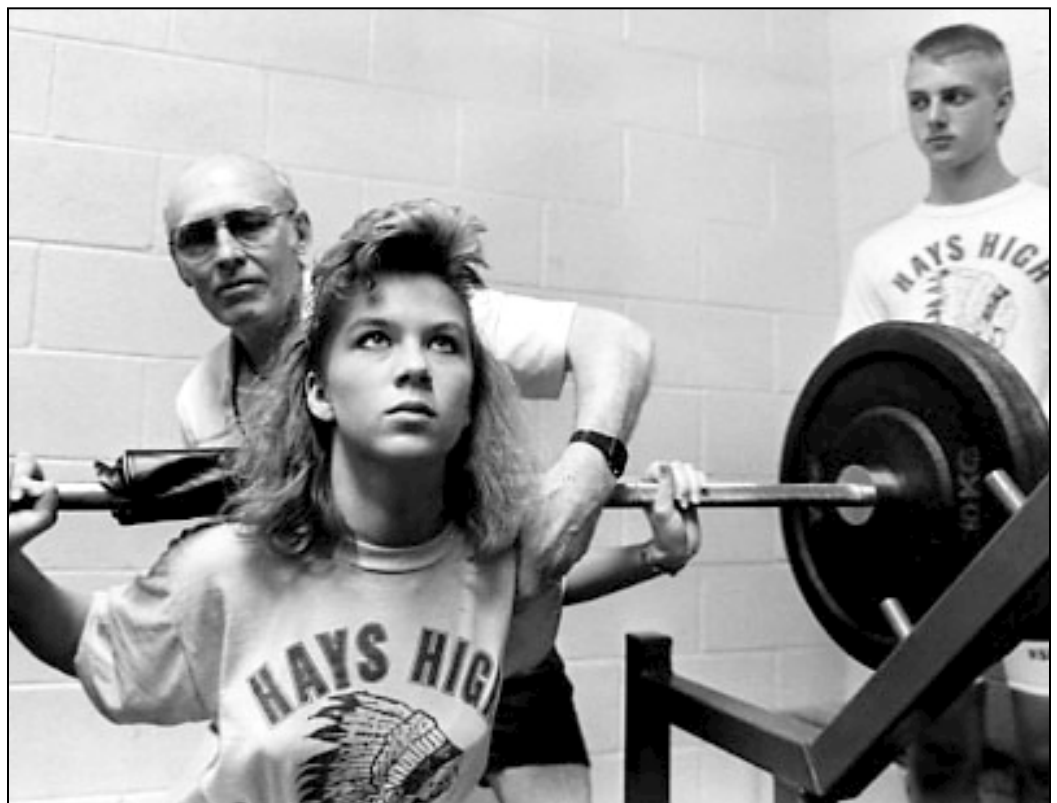
1994, **July** - The NSCA Presidents Award was presented to Steven S. Plisk and David Pearson.
