Devin Neal, a 6'0", 214lb. defensive back from Lexington, KY was one of the most productive defensive backs in the ACC during the 2025 season. Neal was recognized for his production on the field by earning Third Team All-ACC honors for the 2025 season. Neal led the team in tackles with 88, and had 1.5 tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks, 8 pass breakups, and 2 quarterback hurries.

Based on his work ethic, consistency, leadership, and on field performance, Neal received the Defensive Newcomer of the Year Award for the 2025 season. Neal was also the recipient of the 2025 Iron Hoo Award. The Iron Hoo Competition is a culmination of players' off-season training testing numbers. The players earn points in various weight room and field-testing metrics based on their performance compared to their peers. The events are power clean, back squat, bench press, vertical jump, broad jump, 20-yard sprint, and pro agility drill.

Neal's work ethic, attention to detail, toughness, and consistency allowed him to thrive in the weight room. His testing numbers were as follows: back squat 505lbs, front squat 405lbs, power clean 315lbs, bench press 345lbs, 225 rep 16, broad jump 10'5.5", vertical jump of 35.5", 10-yard dash 1.42, 20-yard dash 2.54, pro agility 4.13, and a top velocity of 21.03 MPH.
