

NSCA Alvin Roy Award for Career Achievement

OBJECTIVE: This esteemed award is given to an individual, 70 years of age or older, or posthumously, whose career achievements made a substantial impact on the scientific understanding, methodologies, or practice of resistance training as a component of sports conditioning. The NSCA Board of Directors carefully deliberates to select the recipient of this prestigious award.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT:

- 70 years of age or older, or posthumous
- Nominee does not have to be a current or past member of the NSCA
- Individuals must be nominated by a current member of the Board of Directors but recommendations may be submitted to the Board by any current member of the Association
- Nominations must be accompanied by a brief supporting statement regarding the nominee's qualifications for consideration for the award
- Nominations and recommendations must be received by December 15 to be considered for the following year's award

PROCEDURES:

1. A call for nominations from NSCA Headquarters will be made to the Board of Directors (BOD)
2. Headquarters will check eligibility requirements of nominees and recommendations
3. The winner will be selected by the NSCA Board of Directors at the January Board meeting
 - a. The Board of Directors will also consider the recommendations and nominate any recommendation, if desired
4. Final nominations will be placed on a ballot for vote
5. The nominee receiving the majority vote of the Board of Directors will receive the award

VOTING PROCESS:

The Board may select to give the award or not, no matter how many nominations, by majority vote.

1. If only one nominee, the Board will vote to either give the award or not
2. If two nominees, the nominee receiving the majority vote will be awarded
3. If there are more than two nominees, the Board may choose a plurality vote (nominee with the most votes) or a preferential vote (Nominees are placed in the order of preference to win the award. If there is a clear majority for one nominee, then that individual will be awarded. If there is not, the individual with the lowest preference will be dropped off the ballot and the vote will begin again until there are only two nominees or a clear majority for one.)

Whether the work done by the individual was unique and innovative and not the proliferation or substantiation of previous strength and conditioning work

Whether the nominee has supported the NSCA (or if pre NSCA, their work would support the mission and goals of the NSCA today)
